NEUTER AND SPAY – THE ONLY WAY

The Humane Society of New Zealand Inc. believes that the single most important tool in the effort to deal with unwanted animals is the prevention of indiscriminate breeding. It is our absolute belief that all pets should be desexed.

In support of this, the Society administers a Spay and Neuter assistance fund whereby people who wish to desex their pets but are having difficulty with the cost can apply for assistance.

WHO WE ARE



The Humane Society of New Zealand Inc. was established as a registered charity in 1975, and is now registered with the Charities Commission. Started by a small group of volunteers, it continues to be run totally by volunteers. The Society receives no funding at all, relying on membership, donations and bequests to continue its work. The Society does not own facilities, but relies on its volunteers to take the rescued animals into their homes with their own families and animals.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Although our volunteers are not professionals, between us we have amassed a great wealth of experience. We are happy to provide a listening ear and suggestions for those struggling with an animal related difficulty. We DO NOT give advice pertaining to health matters as this is the domain of a qualified Veterinarian.

Our volunteers take phone calls 7 days a week, between 9am and 5pm, assisting the callers in any way possible. Please respect their privacy and call during these hours only.

WHAT DO WE DO?

The Humane Society of New Zealand Inc. endeavours to improve the situations of needy animals as it is made aware of them. We rescue, rehabilitate and rehome.

We rescue dogs from Animal Shelters when their 7-day period for claiming has ended and they are due for euthanasia.

We rehabilitate these dogs according to their needs. They are fully Vet checked, treated for worms and fleas, vaccinated, desexed, registered and microchipped. They are then carefully rehomed following a detailed procedure and property check.

The Society provides support to the new owners over the rehoming time and is always available for ongoing advice and assistance.

We also maintain a “Free List”, of dogs and cats who are still with their owners but are in need of new homes for a variety of reasons. We assist many animals in this way.
