What is the Internet vs the WWW (World Wide Web)?

The **world wide web**, or web for short, are the pages you see when you're at a device and you're online. But **the internet is the network of connected computers** that the web works on, as well as what emails and files travel across

The Internet is not like a telephone network. The global Internet consists of tens of thousands of interconnected networks run by service providers, individual companies, universities and governments.

What is Google

Google is an American company that is most commonly known as a search engine.

Although the company made its name as a search engine, and the vast majority of its income comes from advertising because of this, it has branched out into a number of areas such as cloud computing, software and hardware.

Recently the company moved into the mobile hardware market by creating its first Google phone, called Pixel.

The cloud unit of the company is called Google Cloud, which contains things like G-Suite, the company's productivity applications like Gmail and Google Drive.

What is a Browser

A web browser is a software application for accessing the **World Wide Web**. When a user requests a web page from a particular website, the web browser retrieves the necessary content from a web server and then displays the page on the user's device.

Example Browsers include: Chrome by Google, Edge Chromium by Microsoft, Safari by Apple, Firefox by Mozilla and previously internet Explorer also by Microsoft.

What is a Search Engine?

a program that searches for and identifies items in a database that correspond to keywords or characters specified by the user, used especially for finding particular sites on the World Wide Web. Among them Google, Bing and Yahoo are dominating the search engine market (on an aggregated search traffic basis) and are used daily by most people in the world.

What is the Address Bar?

The term address bar refers to the text field in a web browser that identifies the user's location on the web and allows them to access different websites. The address bar is known as a location bar, and in Google Chrome, it's called the omnibox. [LINK](#) it is therefore possible to navigate the WWW by typing in a web sites URL (Address) directly into the Address bar and not searching for a page on the web via a Search Engine
